EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Emergency Flood Relief Program in Afghanistan was a charitable initiative providing a food package to flood- affected families during the month of May. Najm Charity Foundation implemented the program with a generous donation from HAYAT FOUNDATION UK. The program involved the distribution of 145 food packages in Baghlan, Afghanistan.

Beneficiaries:

This program benefited a total of 145 families and 1015 individuals in Baghlan. Each family received a full package of (Floor-50Kg, Rice-10Kg, Oil- 5Lit, Bean- 5Kg, Sugar 3Kg and Green Tea 1Kg).

Distribution:

After providing the all required material, the volunteers started packing of the ration in a good manner. For smooth distribution and avoiding disturbance and disorganization, NAJM charity foundation prepared a safe, secure and sheltered place for the distribution. All rations were arranged in a manner which beneficiary was able to stay with their rations. All beneficiaries were called to come to specified food distribution point (FDP) to receive their food package on 21th of May 2024 in Kabul province. During the distribution, in addition to the banners indicating the donor, the volunteers acknowledged the beneficiaries in verbal communication. Each family received one proposed ration of food package that mentioned above.

Impact:

The Emergency Flood Relief Program in Afghanistan had a significant effect on the lives of the beneficiaries during the challenging days following the floods. The distribution of food package provided a valuable source of nutrition for families who may not have had access to such food items. The program also helped to promote a sense of community and generosity during the food shortage in this difficult Situation.

INTRODUCTION

Heavy rainfall in central Afghanistan has caused a new wave of flash floods on the 17 May 2024. This is while the country still reeling from last week's devastating floods. The newly affected provinces are Ghor, Faryad, Sar-e Pul, Samangan, Balkh and Badghis. (IFRC, 18 May 2024)

On 17 and 18 May, heavy rainfall led to flash floods in the Northern and Western regions of Afghanistan, impacting 10 districts in Ghor province (Charsada, Dawlatyar, Dolayna, Ferozkoh, Lal Wa Sarjangal, Murghab, Pasaband, Saghar, Shahrak, and Tolak districts), as well as eight districts in Faryab province (Almar, Bilcheragh, Chehlgazi, Dawlatabad, Khaibar, Maimana, Pashtun Kot and Qaysar districts). While assessments are ongoing for both provinces, initial reports indicate the large-scale floods have resulted in the deaths of at least 120 people with hundreds more people missing and extensive damage to private properties and civilian infrastructure. Humanitarian partners and local authorities anticipate the number of casualties will increase significantly as search and rescue efforts continue amid reports that people may be trapped under collapsed buildings. In northern Afghanistan, the initial flooding on 17 May in Faryab province reportedly affected around 560 households followed by a

second wave of flooding on 18 May which affected approximately 1,300 households across eight districts. (OCHA, 20 May 2024)

Humanitarian partners are ramping up response efforts following 10 and 11 May heavy rainfall and flash floods in Baghlan, Badakhshan and Takhar provinces that affected more than 60,000 people. Across the region to date, approximately 7,800 homes have been confirmed as either destroyed or damaged leaving over 5,000 families displaced according to the Afghan Ministry of Refugee and Repatriation (MoRR). Across the three provinces, MoRR reported 347 people were killed and 1,651 injured due to floods. (OCHA, 22 May 2024)

The distribution of food packages was conducted in a safe, secure and organized manner, ensuring that all beneficiaries received their ration as mentioned above. The distribution was carried out by the NAJM Charity Foundation and local volunteers.

The program was implemented in Baghlan provinces, which is the host of different types of vulnerable people like: Flood- affected family, internally displaced people (IDPs), widowed, disabled people and orphans. It ensures that the program has been widely implemented and hoped that many people will be affected by it. The program was carried out during the challenging days after flash floods.

Overall, the Emergency Flood Relief Program in Afghanistan has been conducted in a hygienic and organized manner which had a positive outcome, providing food package to families and individuals in need, and helping to promote community spirit and generosity during this critical situation.

IMPLEMENTATION

The methodology and steps used in implementing the Emergency Flood Relief Program in Afghanistan by the NAJM Charity Foundation are:

Needs assessment: The NAJM Charity Foundation has conducted a needs assessment to identify areas and communities with high-level food insecurity and vulnerability. It has included factors such as Financial losses and house destruction, income level, household size, and vulnerability (e.g., widows, orphans, disabled individuals, etc).

Beneficiary selection: Based on the needs assessment, the NAJM Charity Foundation has selected beneficiaries who met predetermined criteria with the support of district council needy areas. The area included income level, household size, and vulnerability. The beneficiaries have been selected through a registration form or collaboration with local authorities and community leaders.

Market Assessment and Providing material: After donor approval the NAJM cahrity foundation assigned a technical team for providing high quality material from local market. The team checked all the local markets and found the material of good quality and transported them to the stock and started packing them.

Distribution planning: The NAJM Charity Foundation had planned the distribution process. This process has involved identifying distribution points, scheduling distribution date and time, and coordinating with local authorities and volunteers.

Distribution: After packing the food items in the stock, the food packages were conveyed to the distribution point. The distribution of food package was conducted in a safe, secure and organized manner, ensuring that all beneficiaries received their rations.

Monitoring and evaluation: The NAJM Charity Foundation assigned the MEAL team to monitore the whole distribution process. They were checking beneficiaries national indentity cards and to ensure wether they are in the list of selected benficiaries. In addition to this, they checked all rations to be completed as per the above table and even measure some rations as sample.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Based on the success of the Emergency Flood Relief Program in Afghanistan, we would recommend that HAYAT FOUNDATION consider continuing to support similar charitable initiatives in the future. Donations such as the one made by HAYAT FOUNDATION can have a significant impact on the lives of vulnerable communities, providing them with much-needed support during difficult times.

To maximize the impact of future donations, HAYAT FOUNDATION may consider collaborating with reputable charitable organizations such as the NAJM Charity Foundation. Such organizations have the expertise and infrastructure needed to implement charitable initiatives efficiently and effectively, ensuring that donations reach the intended beneficiaries.
